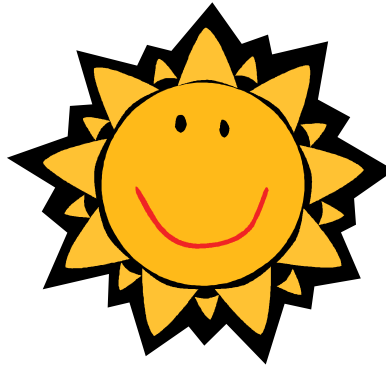

FOX VALLEY SUMMER SCHOOL CONSORTIUM GENERAL GUIDELINES

In an effort to provide students with learning opportunities, the Fox Valley Summer School Consortium was formed in an ongoing effort by the eleven involved school districts to offer students viable educational opportunities at any of the eleven participating districts during the summer months.

1. All students from the consortium school districts are eligible to attend classes. Students who have graduated, non-consortium students and adults may attend classes by paying a fee that will cover the cost of the class.
2. If the same course is offered in more than one district, the student is expected to take the course in their home district.
3. **Summer School Enrollment Policy for Students Attending Classes in Other Districts:** Any parent wishing to enroll a child for a summer school class that is **OUTSIDE** of their home school district should return a completed registration form to the **SCHOOL THEIR CHILD PRESENTLY ATTENDS**. This registration form shall be signed by a counselor/principal from the student's school, the counselor/principal shall check that all recorded information is accurate and complete, and then forward the registration form to the Director of Summer School of the student's home district. The Director of Summer School may sign to grant approval for the class(es), retains a copy of the registration form for their records, and forwards the approved registration form to the Director of Summer School of the school district where the class is being held. The Director of Summer School has the discretion of granting or rejecting approval for students taking a class in another district.
4. **Enrollment Policy for Statewide Open Enrollment Students:** Students participating in open enrollment should consider their school district of attendance as their home school district and should indicate this on the registration form.
5. **Enrollment Policy for Home School Students:** Home school students participating in summer school should consider their school district of attendance as their home school district and should indicate this on the registration form.
6. Registration procedures and deadlines do vary. Please check with each individual school district.
7. Courses may be canceled due to insufficient enrollment or lack of staff. If a course is canceled, parents will be notified.
8. Grade indicators refer to the grade the student will be in during the upcoming school year.
9. Please check the course descriptions for exact times, dates, and locations - as class schedules do vary.
10. Transportation costs for field trips will be the responsibility of the student.
11. Explanation of types of credit: Secondary level only. Philosophy and practice concerning the type of credit is varied within the Fox Valley Summer School Consortium. Students need to check with their home school district counselor or summer school coordinator to obtain the appropriate information regarding the earning of secondary credits for either credit deficient or gifted and talented consortium courses.
12. Attendance policies vary throughout the districts. Credit deficient courses have strict attendance expectations.
13. Credits taken outside of the district will be accepted only with prior written approval from the home school district. Districts need to submit grade reports to each appropriate summer school coordinator. The grade reports should be sent to the home school district and student one week following the completion of the summer school session.

During the registration session, please bring your completed registration form to the site your child will **attend** summer school. All registrations are on a first come, first served basis. Enrichment classes may be limited due to the availability of teachers.

If you are unable to attend one of the evening registration sessions, you may drop off your registration form, after the final kick-off night, at the site your child will attend summer school (c/o Summer School Coordinator).

No early registrations or phone registrations accepted. Late registrations will be accepted at each summer school site on the first two days of summer school if there is still space available.

If you wish to receive a **Confirmation letter**, please include a self addressed, self stamped envelope with your registration form. Confirmation letters will be sent in late May or early June. Class lists will be posted on the school doors by June 11th.

Policies: All Appleton Area School District policies during the regular academic school year regarding dress, behavior, etc. are in effect during summer school.

If your child has any health concerns or special needs, please indicate that on the registration form and tell the coordinator at registration. If your child has an IEP or 504 plan, please indicate that on the registration form and give a copy of the plan to the site coordinator. According to WI Dept of Public Instruction, summer school classes are not tailored to implement a student's IEP.

Material fees: To be paid the first day of summer school. Please make checks payable to Appleton Area School District.

Waivers: Students who qualify for the free milk or the free or reduced lunch program may waive material fees. Please verify this with the site coordinator upon registration.

APPLETON AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT 2012 ELEMENTARY COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

***When looking at grade level, use grade entering in fall.*

Please see registration form for specific times and locations that each course is offered. Class start times are 8:30, 9:30, and 10:30 and meet for one hour.

COURSE:	Kindergarten Here I Come	Grade: K
CONTENT:	This class is designed to introduce and/or reinforce basic readiness skills for kindergarten. (Runs 3 hours from 8:30 to 11:30am)	
FEE:	\$10.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	Core Knowledge Kindergarten Readiness at Classical	Grade: K
CONTENT:	This course will provide an introduction to the Core Knowledge curriculum using a classical framework. All Kindergarten core topics will be introduced along with basic developmental skills. This class is intended as preparation for children who will be entering kindergarten in the fall of 2008. Students enrolled in Classical School will be given preference for enrollment, but non-Classical School students will be accepted, space permitting. (Runs 3 hours from 8:30 to 11:30am)

COURSE:	1st Grade Here I Come	Grade: 1
CONTENT:	A course designed for children who have completed kindergarten. Students will continue the curriculum from kindergarten, doing enriching math, reading, writing, science, social studies, computers, physical education, and art activities. (Runs 3 hours from 8:30 to 11:30am)	
FEE:	\$10.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	Core Knowledge 1st Grade Readiness at Classical	Grade: 1
CONTENT:	A course designed for children who have completed kindergarten. Students will continue the Core Knowledge curriculum from kindergarten, doing enriching math, reading, writing, science, social studies, computers, physical education, and art activities. <i>Class meets from 8:30-11:30.</i> (Runs 3 hours from 8:30 to 11:30am)

COURSE:	2nd Grade Math Practice/ Marvels	Grade: 2
CONTENT:	For students who need additional practice with counting, recognizing coins, basic addition and subtraction, telling time, place value, and basic word problems.

COURSE:	2nd Grade Reading Adventures	Grade: 2
CONTENT:	This course is designed to help students who need additional practice learning basic reading strategies including: sight words, phonics and decoding skills, word study, understanding what they have read, vocabulary building, and writing as it relates to all of these areas.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	3rd & 4th Grade Math Practice/ Marvels	Grades: 3 & 4
CONTENT:	This course is designed for students who need extra help with basic math concepts and skills such as adding, subtracting, multiplying, dividing, place value, telling time, identifying and counting money, and solving story problems.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	3rd & 4th Grade Reading Adventures	Grades 3 & 4
CONTENT:	This course is designed to help students who need additional practice learning basic reading strategies including: phonics and decoding skills, word study, vocabulary building, comprehension, and writing sentences including punctuation and sentence structure.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable first day of summer school.	

COURSE:	5th - 7th Grade Math Practice/ Marvels	Grades: 5- 7
CONTENT:	This course is designed for students who need extra help with basic math concepts and skills such as multiplication and division, telling time, working with fractions, counting money and making change, and solving story problems.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	5th-7th Grade Reading Adventures	Grades 5 - 7
CONTENT:	This course is designed to help students who need additional practice learning basic reading strategies including word study, vocabulary building, reading comprehension, and writing sentences, paragraphs, and stories.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE;	Advanced Creative Woodshop	Grades 4-7
CONTENT:	Advanced woodworking is for those children who are pretty capable of using a hammer and hand saw to make things out of wood. Parents are encouraged to provide leather gloves for their child to help guard against splinters and abrasions. Projects done last year may be repeated again this year.	
FEE:	\$10.00 payable first day of summer school	
COURSE:	Basketball and Volleyball Skills	Grades 4-8
CONTENT:	Have fun this summer and get some exercise! In this class you will learn the basic skills needed for basketball and volleyball. Regular attendance is requested in order to learn all basic skills and have practice games. This class is for students entering 4 th grade and above.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	Beginning Creative Woodshop	Grades 2-7
CONTENT:	Basic use of woodworking tools for sawing, sanding assembling, and finishing. Parents are encouraged to purchase leather gloves for their child to help guard against splinters and abrasions.	
FEE:	\$10.00 payable first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	Books are Summer Fun	Grades 2-7
CONTENT:	Students will experience the world of books through a variety of creative activities intended to develop and broaden their appreciation for and love of good literature.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable the first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	Book Club Plus	Grades 2-7
CONTENT:	Book lovers this class is for you! This class is designed for students with good basic reading skills who enjoy additional challenges. Readers will enjoy a book club atmosphere with focuses on different genres and author studies.	
FEE:	\$5.00 payable the first day of summer school.	
COURSE:	Brain Games	Grades 3-8
CONTENT:	Does your brain need a workout this summer? This is the class for you! Learn the skills of logic while playing board games and working on activities that will challenge and test your skills of logic, memory and reasoning! This class is intended for children entering 3 rd grade and above and you must have a brain to enroll!

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS *Elementary Music Camp 2012*

Ear Training: A basic general music class for students interesting in developing their musical ears. The focus will be tonal memory, melody, and rhythm patterns.

Sight Singing: A basic general music class for students interested in developing their ability to read music from the printed score. Concepts such as Major Key, Solfegio, and musical intervals will be studied.

Note Reading: A grass-roots level class in following a printed octavo. Terms such as *grand staff*, *repeat*, *fine*, and *da capo* will be studied.

Acting Class: A dynamic class in performance for singers. Techniques such as physical alignment, movement, facial expression, and text communication will be studied.

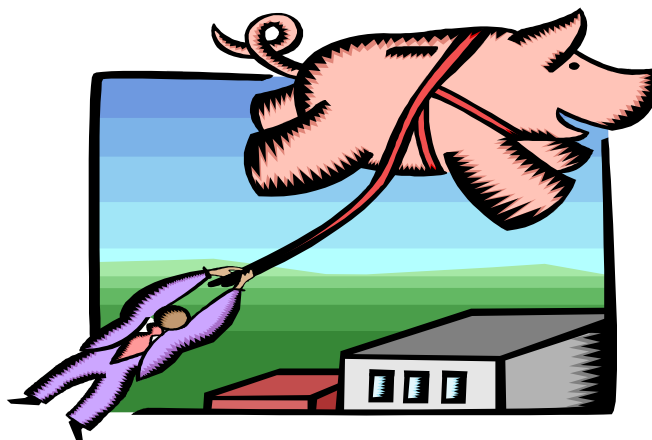

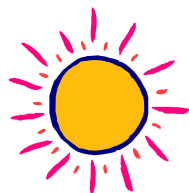

COURSE: **9140 Integrated Mathematics 3** Offered S1 & S2 Credit Deficient Only
.5 Credit/semester

PREREQUISITES: Applied Integrated Mathematics 2 or Geometry. Open to credit deficient students in Grades 10, 11, and 12. Students with a course in Advanced Algebra are NOT eligible.

CONTENT: This is the final course in the 3-year Integrated Mathematics sequence. Concepts covered in this course will use those covered in Integrated Mathematics 1 and 2 as a foundation. A more in-depth study of algebra, geometry, statistics, probability and problem solving techniques will be undertaken. 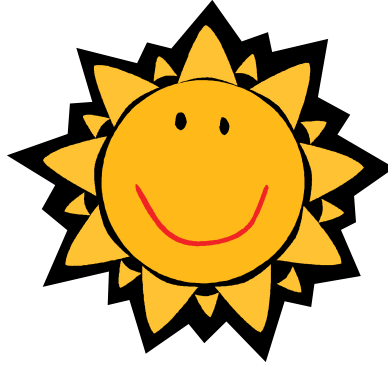

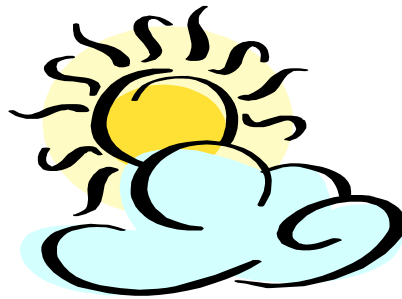

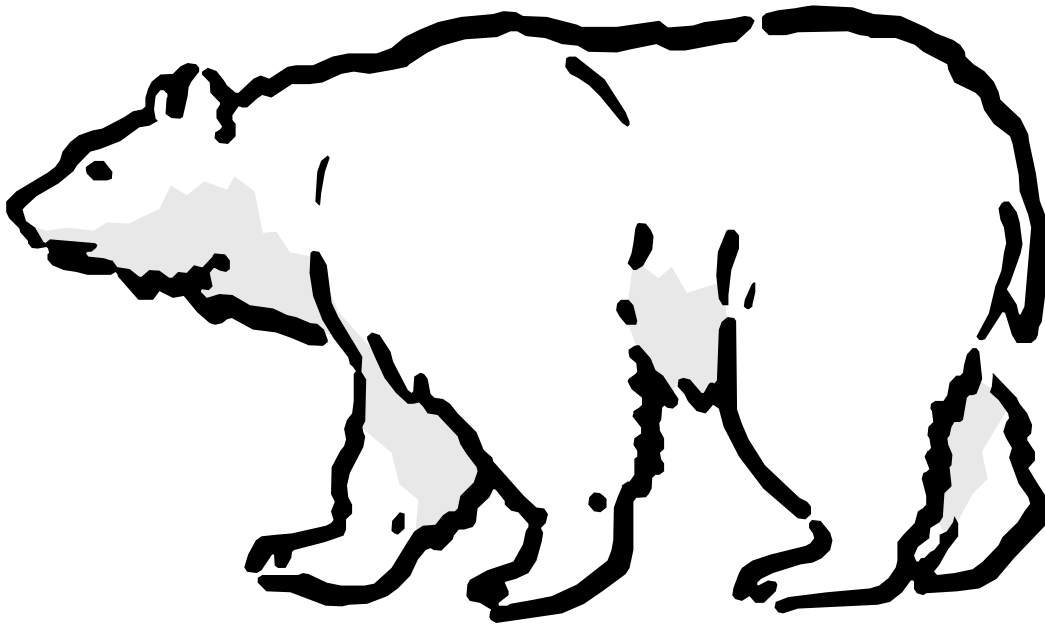

Fun with Music: Cost: \$5

Future Stars: Cost: \$5

Description: Do you like to be the center of attention? Do you like to work with a group? Do you like to have fun? If so, then this class is for you. There is something for everyone! In this class our focus will be on the many ways we communicate with others using our voice and body language. We will interact with individual and group activities which include readers, theater, play/skit production, pantomime, storytelling, poetry/prose reading, and much more.

Games Galore: Cost: No Fee

Description: Students participate in games that require critical thinking skills, problem-solving, strategizing, math computation, language skills, team-building, cooperative learning and physical activity. Games to include: Scrabble, Risk, Monopoly, Life, PayDay, Checkers, Chinese Checkers, Mancala, 'Smath, Boggle, Uno, Phase 10, Sudoku/Ken-Ken; in addition to computer games.

Geo Caching: Cost: \$5

Description: Geocaching is a fun activity that combines being outside and active with high-tech gadgets – the GPS unit. 2012 SUMMER SCHOOL

NEENAH JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT

The following summer school courses have been approved by the Neenah Joint School District's Board of Education:

High School remedial course offerings give secondary students who have failed a course during the school year another opportunity to earn credit toward graduation.

Attendance Rules: Unlike the regular school year, any student who is absent more than two days, either excused or unexcused will be dismissed from the course. If a student is tardy less than 15 minutes, it will be counted as one-half day's absence. Students will be marked tardy if they are late from their break. Tardiness that exceeds 15 minutes will be counted as a full absence. Students will be expected to be in their seats when class begins or they will be marked tardy.

Students registered for classes that meet **June 11 - July 27** are allowed **3 days** absence. Students who are absent more that 3 days, either excused or unexcused will be dismissed from the class.

The only exceptions to the attendance rule that will be considered include absences due to the serious illness/hospitalization of the student or the death of a student's immediate family member. Absence such as illness, spending time in jail, court appointments, bike or car trouble, family vacations, suspensions, etc. do apply to the two day limit stated above.

As noted with each course, classes are Monday through Friday. Session 1 begins Monday, June 11, and Session 2 begins Monday, July 9. If you have questions, please call Neenah High School, 751-6900, ext. 154 or 128.

The deadline for registration is, **June 8, 2012. Early student registration is imperative because all course offerings depend on sufficient enrollment.**

Neenah High School Summer School Courses

English

NS 17650 LITERACY SKILLS FOR SUCCESS -½ credit, original elective

- Schedule: **Mon., June 11 - Fri., July 27 7:30 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. M-F No classes the week of July 4th.**
- Open to: Incoming 9th graders, specifically students who achieved Basic or Minimal Performance on 8th Grade Reading Assessments.
- Location: Neenah High School
- Content: This course is designed to improve the level of reading proficiency required for high school English. Enrollment in this course is based on need demonstrated by scores on the Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Exam, other reading assessments, and teacher recommendation. Students will receive instruction and practice with word recognition strategies such as root words, prefixes, suffixes, patterns within words, multiple meanings and word origins. Students will also receive instruction and practice with comprehension strategies which include the ability to identify and use skills such as main ideas and supporting details, inferences, fact and opinion, cause and effect and conclusions. In addition, application skills commonly used to adjust reading strategies for different purposes such as skimming and scanning, organizing information, finding supporting details and sequencing will be covered. Students may earn 0.5 credit toward their elective requirement.
- In-coming 9th grade students, who successfully meet the set criteria at the end of the summer session, will begin their freshman year with English 9 and may not be required to “double-dose” with Read 180 and English 9.
- Activities: Completing activities designed to enhance the reading ability of each individual student. Also, students will use technology to assist in their development of effective reading skills. Components of High School preparedness will be implemented in order to familiarize students with the facility as well as expectations of Neenah High School.
- Cost: Materials Fee – A nominal fee may apply

NS 15100/15150 ENGLISH 9 - ½ credit, remedial

- Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 7:45 a.m. – 11:25 a.m. M-F
- Open to: Students who did not successfully complete **either semester** of English 9.
- Location: Neenah High School
- Content: This course is designed for average ability students who need to develop their communication skills through the study of the English language, speech, composition, literature and developmental reading. Additional major units of study include grammar, usage, sentence patterns, paragraph development, and dramatic form. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
- Activities: Students receive developmental reading instruction, study literature, write compositions, and participate in speaking and listening activities.
- Cost: Materials Fee – A nominal fee may apply

NS 15300 SPEECH - ½ credit, remedial

- Schedule: Session 2: Mon., July 9 - Fri., July 27 7:45 a.m. – 11:25 a.m. M-F
- Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the Speech requirement for grade 10.
- Location: Neenah High School
- Content: This course is designed to give students an opportunity to express themselves in a variety of speaking situations and to help them feel at ease with oral communication. Students will gain experience by preparing and delivering a variety of talks such as demonstration, informative, and persuasive speeches. Time will be devoted to selecting appropriate topics, gathering information, and organizing materials. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
- Activities: Interpersonal communication, group discussion, giving impromptu speeches, developing listening skills, preparing and delivering formal speeches, and evaluating oral presentations.
- Cost: Materials Fee – A nominal fee may apply.

NS 15500 LITERATURE/COMPOSITION 10 - ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 **12:00 p.m. - 3:40 pm. M-F**
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the required semester of English 10 Literature/Composition
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course is designed for students who have and will continue to develop an average command of language skills. Students will study mythology of cultures other than the Greeks, *Julius Caesar* or another Shakespearean play, and a variety of additional literature selections. In addition, students will continue to develop multi-paragraph writing skills, including sentence structure, paragraph development, grammar, and usage skills. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Selective reading, writing compositions, and developing usage and vocabulary skills.
Cost: Materials fee - A nominal fee may apply.

NS 15750/15900 AMERICAN LITERATURE 11/COMPOSITION 11 – ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon. June 11 - Fri., June 29 7:45 a.m. – 11:25 a.m. M-F
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the semester of American Literature 11 **or** Composition 11
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course is designed to present a survey of the prose and poetry of America. The works of numerous American writers will be read and discussed. In addition there will be a review of sentencing and paragraphing techniques to the development of expository essays. A portion of the class is devoted to grammar review with an emphasis on the development of writing skills rather than on the learning of terminology. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Large and small group discussions, individual reading, class and individual projects. Writing sentences, paragraphs, and themes; small-group discussions; and vocabulary study.
Cost: Students should provide a USB drive. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 16100/16350 WORLD LITERATURE 12/COMPOSITION 12 – ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 **12:00 – 3:40 p.m. M-F**
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the semester of World Literature 12 **or** Composition 12
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course will examine a number of universal themes found in the literature written by significant world authors. Students will gain an appreciation of literature as a reflection of the cultures, philosophies, and national characteristics of people of other nations. Students will study writing models and will be given numerous opportunities to develop their writing skills. This writing course will acquaint students with the writing process and the value of writing in contemporary society. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Reading and critical examination of articles, essays, short stories, plays poems and books, participation in class discussion, writing of comparison/contrast papers, opinion papers, character studies; essay exams related to the themes/ideas discussed in the literature. Students will be guided through the natural stages of the writing process: creating shaping and completing the essay. Vocabulary study will also be included.

HEALTH

NS 34000 HEALTH - ½ credit

Schedule: **Mon., June 11 - Fri., July 27 7:45 a.m. – 10:15 a.m. M-F No Classes Week of July 4th**
Open to: Grades 9-10-11-12 *This class is open for original credit or for remediation.*
Prerequisite: None
Content: This course should be taken when parents/student feel that the student is mature enough to benefit most from the content. Required at the state level for graduation, Health Education emphasizes a variety of health-related topics. Six units of study are taught: Mental Health, Nutrition, Life Cycle, Relationships, Disease and Drugs and Alcohol. **Note:** A student may be exempt from the family life education section by a written request from the pupil's parent/guardian. An alternative unit of instruction will be required. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lecture, large and small group discussions/work, videos, speakers, research (including Internet), presentations and self-defense.
Cost: Materials Fee – A nominal fee may apply.

MATHEMATICS

NS 35000/35050 GENERAL MATH - ½ credit, original or remedial

- Schedule: **Mon., June 11 - Fri., July 27 10:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. M-F No classes the week of July 4th.**
- Open to: In-coming 9th graders, specifically students who achieved Basic or Minimal Performance on the 8th Grade Math Assessments or current Neenah High School students who have failed to complete this course and are currently in sequences.
NOTE: In general, degree-granting institutions in the United States, including all Wisconsin public and private colleges and universities, will not accept this course as fulfilling a mathematics entrance requirement. Technical colleges will accept this course
- Location: Neenah High School
- Content: This course is designed for non-college-bound students. It provides for a continued development of basic computational skills needed in the world of work. There will be units of applied mathematics included in this course. In general, degree-granting institutions in the United States, including all Wisconsin public and private colleges and universities, will not accept this course as fulfilling a mathematics entrance requirement. Technical colleges will accept this course. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
- In-coming 9th grade students who successfully complete this course will begin their freshman year with Pre-Algebra.
- Activities: Lectures, small-group discussions, individualized instruction, and problem solving.
Components of High School preparedness will be implemented in order to familiarize students with the facility as well as expectations of Neenah High School.
- Cost: A four-function (+, -, x, ÷) calculator is recommended. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS35100 PRE-ALGEBRA – ½ credit, remedial

- Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 7:45 a.m. - 11:25 a.m. M-F
- Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the **first semester** of Pre-Algebra
NOTE: In general, degree-granting institutions in the United States, including all Wisconsin public and private colleges will not accept this course as fulfilling a mathematics entrance requirement. Technical colleges will accept this course.
- Location: Neenah High School
- Content: This course is designed for students with below-average mathematics ability. There is ample opportunity for classroom discussion plus additional time for supervised study and individual help. The course contains units of study on operations, open sentences, solving equations and inequalities, directed numbers, polynomials, statistics, and applied mathematics. This course is intended to be followed by Algebra 1. Grading will be on an A-F basis.

NS35390 ALGEBRA 1 – ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 2: Mon., July 9 - Fri., July 27 7:45 a.m. - 11:25 a.m. M-F
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the **second semester** of Algebra 1
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course is designed for students with average or below average mathematics ability. The course content stresses the precision of language, algebraic structure, and manipulative skills in algebra and statistics. This course is intended to be followed by Geometry or Integrated Mathematics. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, small group discussions, and individualized instruction.
Cost: A scientific calculator is required. A Texas Instruments scientific calculator (TI-30X) is recommended. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 35720 GEOMETRY - ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 **12:00 p.m. – 3:40 p.m. M-F**
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete the **first semester** of Geometry
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course is designed for those students who do not plan on taking Pre-Calculus at NHS or upper level math classes in college. This course includes the study of congruent triangles, parallel lines, planes, polygons, circles and spheres, statistics, trigonometry, and proof writing. Students will work on projects that apply what they are learning in the classroom to real world situations. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, small group discussions, computer/calculator activities, and individualized instruction.
Cost: A scientific calculator is required. A Texas Instruments scientific calculator (TI-30X) is recommended. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

Students will work on projects that apply what they are learning in the classroom to real world situations. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, small group discussions, computer/calculator activities, and individualized instruction.

NS 36100/36150 CONSUMER MATH – ½ credit, remedial

Open to: Students who did not successfully complete **either semester** of Consumer Math. Note: In general, degree granting institutions in the United States, including all Wisconsin public and private colleges and universities, will not accept this course as fulfilling a mathematics entrance requirement. Technical colleges will accept this course.
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course will provide an opportunity for students to apply business problems to the real world. This course covers a variety of business topics including bank reconciliation, basic algebra, percents, discounts, markups, inventory, simple and compound interest, promissory and discount notes, annuities, installment loans, depreciation, financial reports, and business statistics. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, group discussions, individual instruction.
Cost: A scientific calculator is required. A Texas Instruments scientific calculator (TI-30X) is recommended. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 36220 ALGEBRA 2 – ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 7:45 a.m. - 11:25 a.m. M-F
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete **semester one** of Algebra 2
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course is designed for those students who do not plan on taking Pre-Calculus at NHS or upper level math classes in college. This class provides a continuation of algebra skills with specific emphasis on functions, theory of quadratic equations, factoring matrices, conic sections, systems of equations, and the complex number system. Students will work on projects that apply what they are learning in the classroom to real-world situations. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, small group discussions, computer/calculator activities, and individualized instruction.
Cost: A Texas Instruments graphing calculator, TI-84, is recommended but not required for this course. Students will not be allowed to use the TI-89 calculator in this class. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 36240 Algebra 2 - ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 2: Mon., July 9 - Fri., July 27 7:45 a.m. – 11:25 a.m. M-F
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete **semester two** of Algebra 2
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course is designed for those students who do not plan on taking Pre-Calculus at NHS or upper level math classes in college. This class provides a continuation of algebra skills with specific emphasis on functions, theory of quadratic equations, factoring matrices, conic sections, systems of equations, and the complex number system. Students will work on projects that apply what they are learning in the classroom to real-world situations. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, small group discussions, computer/calculator activities, and individualized instruction
Cost: A Texas Instruments graphing calculator, TI-84, is recommended but not required for this course. Students will not be allowed to use the TI-89 calculator in this class. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 51020 Active Lifestyles 2 - ½ credit, remedial

Prerequisite: The student must be able to dive into deep water and swim the front crawl 25 yards, elementary backstroke 25 yards, and be able to swim underwater for 3-4 body lengths.
Location: Neenah High School
Content: Active Lifestyles - This course will include multiple activities to include: health-related fitness, adventure education, outdoor pursuits, individual pursuits, beginning swimming, community water safety, First Aid & AED Awareness, dance and individual and team activities.
Activities: Described above. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Cost: A conservative one-piece swimsuit is required for girls and boxer style swimsuit for boys. A nominal fee may apply.

SCIENCE

NS 55020/55030 PHYSICAL SCIENCE 9 - ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 **12:00 p.m. - 3:40 p.m. M-F**
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete **either semester** of Physical Science.
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This is a laboratory-centered course, covering topics in physics and chemistry. The chemistry topics include matter, atomic structure, chemical reactions and equations, acids and bases, and organic chemistry. The physics topics include measurement, scientific method, heat, mechanics, motion, light, sound, and electricity. Some time will also be spent on technology and the future of science. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, class discussion, and laboratory activities.
Cost: Safety goggles. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 55130/55140 BIOLOGY 1 – ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 1: Mon., June 11 - Fri., June 29 7:45 a.m. – 11:25 a.m. M-F
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete **either semester** of Std. Biology 1
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This is a lab-centered course that uses the molecular approach to study living things. The major biological concepts are viewed in terms of their impact upon man and his environment. Topics of study include scientific inquiry, theories of evolution, characteristics of living things, cell energy, photosynthesis, cell respiration, DNA, cell theory, reproduction, development of living things, genetics, life processes and life systems. Grading will be on an A-F basis.
Activities: Lectures, discussions, laboratory investigations and experiments.
Cost: Safety goggles. Materials fee - a nominal fee may apply.

NS 55620 ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS – ½ credit, remedial

Schedule: Session 2: Mon., July 9 - Fri., July 27 7:45 a.m. - 11:25 a.m. M-F
Open to: Students who did not successfully complete one semester of Environmental Problems
Location: Neenah High School
Content: This course provides for a current awareness of scientific and social environmental problems facing planet Earth. 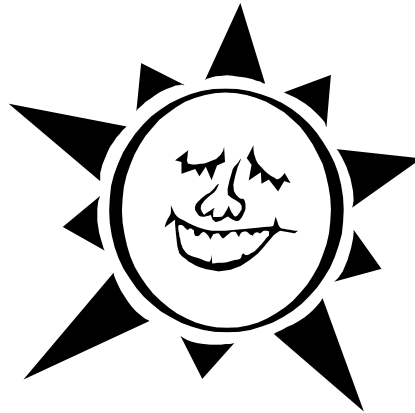

FISHY WINDOW GARDENS & GETTING DIRT UNDER YOUR NAILS - Build a window garden connected to a fish tank to grow flowers and vegetables. Learn to read seed packets so that you plant seeds with proper depth, spacing, and at the right time of year. Explore the contents of organic soil and how worms and other creatures create healthy soil by building rich organic matter from yard or garden waste. Separate and transplant sprouts into containers, and learn how water cycles are affected by plants. Team up with friends to build a garden. Create a simple watering system using a rain barrel and soaker hose. Transplant small plants into your container garden and add mulch to maintain soil moisture and keep weeds down. Work together to assemble simple and inexpensive forms of a greenhouse to extend the growing season. Play "guess the name of the vegetable" by tasting sprouted plants, and learn about how great tasting fresh vegetables are nutritious and good for your health. Learn about the ammonia-nitrogen cycle in fish tanks and gardens and the reason for water changes.

Summer School 2012

Program Regulations:

- **Registration** – The summer school registration window will be from April 6-27. Fees are to be paid at the time of registration. Students will not be scheduled into classes until all fees have been paid. Students will be scheduled into classes on a first come, first serve basis. Please contact the school office at 920-986-3351 ext. 721 if you have any questions. A separate registration form needs to be filled out for each child.
- **Eligibility** – All students from the consortium school districts are eligible to attend classes in Shiocton. Students not enrolled in the Shiocton School District must obtain the signature of the summer school coordinator from their home school district prior to registration. Out-of-district registration forms will not be accepted without a home district signature.
- **Attendance** - Students are expected to attend summer school on a regular basis. Absences jeopardize earning credit for high school classes. If attending high school classes in another district, please note the summer school attendance policy for that particular district.
- **Conduct** – Regular school year rules apply during summer school. Students are expected to go home when their instructional sessions end. If students attend only one or two course sessions, they will not be allowed to wait a long period of time for rides or to talk with other students who are still involved in summer school activities. *Be Safe; Be Respectful; Be Responsible . . . Be the Best That You Can Be!*

Program Fee:

- There will be a \$5.00 registration fee per student attending summer school in Shiocton (\$15 maximum per family not including fee for Cooking class). Please make checks payable to the Shiocton School District. Fees must be paid at the time of registration in order for your child to be officially registered into his/her classes.

Individual Student Course Schedules:

- Student schedules, including room locations and instructor names, will be distributed in late May.

Canceled Classes:

- Courses may have to be canceled due to insufficient numbers or lack of staff. For this reason, we ask that students list their first, second, and third choices for each hour. By doing so, this will prevent the office staff from having to make individual phone calls home to obtain the information. Thank you, in advance, for your assistance with this! ☺

Pupil Transportation:

- Student transportation to and from summer school is the parent's responsibility. No transportation is provided by the school district.

Grade Level:

- The grade level listed for each class refers to the grade which a student will be entering in the fall.

Please Note:

There will be a \$5.00 registration fee per student (\$15 maximum per family for registration fees not including Cooking class). The only class that will require an additional fee is Cooking (\$10.00). **The registration form, along with all registration fees, must be submitted at the same time to the elementary/middle school office.** Checks should be made payable to the Shiocton School District.

Here is an example for the Jones family of 4:

Example 1: Jimmy Jones signs up for 4 classes (not Cooking). Cost = \$5.00 (for summer school registration fee)

Example 2: Cindy Jones signs up for 1 class (not Cooking). Cost = \$5.00 (for summer school registration fee)

Example 3: Johnnie Jones signs up for 3 classes and Cooking. Cost = \$5.00 (for summer school registration fee) plus \$12.00 for Cooking Class. Total Cost = \$17.00 for Johnnie's classes

Example 4: Jesse Jones signs up for 2 classes and Cooking. Cost = \$0 for registration fee (since family already reached the \$15 cap for registration fees) plus \$12.00 for Cooking class. Total Cost = \$12.00

Total Cost for Jones Family Example = \$39.00

Registration Fees for Jones Family Example (4 children, but \$15 maximum per family): \$15.00

Other Fees (2 Cooking classes): \$24.00

\$15.00 + \$24.00 = \$39.00
